In the pages ahead you will see a detailed look at the criteria and what it is that makes a club not only *Platinum*, but *#1*.




In 2003, THE UNION LEAGUE OF PHILADELPHIA, under the expert leadership

success. A true sense of ownership and sincerity is apparent.


Approximately half of the membership belongs to at least one Club Table – a tradition dating back to 1863 where like minded members share meals and interests.

The membership exemplifies our motto, *Love of Country Leads* – they are engaged, involved and incredibly generous. Philanthropic efforts are at the forefront of membership activity. The best example of this is through the League's three Foundations: The Abraham Lincoln, The Youth Work and The Scholarship Foundations.

League members are exceedingly proud to be a part of THE UNION LEAGUE OF PHILADELPHIA. Many members share the privilege of membership by proposing friends, family and/or colleagues. Along with the great judgment of the current

members, the admissions process ensures that only the most qualified individuals are admitted as members. Candidates who become members understand the traditions and personify the values of the founders. They exemplify these qualities in their personal and professional relationships.

Each month approximately 24 new members join THE UNION LEAGUE OF PHILADELPHIA. Membership is on the rise and headed towards a waiting list. Currently there are 2,729 resident members (members who live and/or work within 50 miles of the League). The League's leadership has developed a working plan to include 3,000 resident members with a goal of establishing a waitlist by 2016. With 3,000 active members, available funds will increase for capital improvements by \$1.25 million annually and the League will be more financially secure and more private and exclusive than ever before.

CONDITION *of* FACILITIES

Vision 2000 is nearing completion. Since its inception in 1997 the Master Planning Committee has inspected every area in the House needing attention, outlined a meticulous plan and one by one, checked-off each project. Now, nearly every area of the League House is complete. The main kitchen and Lincoln Hall are the next projects awaiting renovation. This last phase of construction has affectionately been known as *Completing the Vision*.

The guidance and direction of the Master Planning Committee was instrumental in staying on course and on budget – resulting in the finest facilities.

Private Dining events can be hosted in 14 exquisite rooms ranging in size. No matter what type of function, it is guaranteed to be one of a kind, featuring stellar service and fabulous food.

The Inn at the League's 84 hotel rooms offer an oasis in the hustle and bustle of the city with a prime location on the Avenue of the Arts.

The Sir John Templeton Heritage Center houses the impressive collections of the League and displays exhibits and archives in a permanent home.

Most recently, the Smoking Room opened to the delight of the majority of the members. All dining rooms and the rest of the House are completely smoke free. Cigar aficionados are now able to enjoy their favorite cigar in the comfort of the Club.

Many projects have made significant improvements, both financially and in function, but none have changed the face of the League quite like Founders and 1862 by Martin Hamann. This

single act was the final step in ensuring that the League offers the finest dining experience in the region. Executive Chef Martin Hamann and his team consistently deliver five-star cuisine in the ultimate dining venues. *Philadelphia Magazine* reviewed 1862 by Martin Hamann as, “the best restaurant even we can’t get into.” The exclusivity coupled with the experience leaves members and guests in awe and ready to quickly return for more.

With no stone unturned and no corner untouched the League House is beyond beautiful, it’s breathtaking. The constant care and attention to the smallest details keeps the League looking fresh.

The League House is a haven providing refuge and relaxation for the membership. It is home away from home, where memories are made.

possible without the dedication and efforts of every employee.




The average length of employment is 14 years. This is a true testament to the League's management. There are 298 employees who tirelessly work to ensure that the Club House is in pristine condition, that phone calls are answered immediately, follow up occurs with complete resolution within 24 hours and that the members have an experience that exceeds expectations, every time.

"Whatever it Takes - Make it Happen!" is the staff's motto. Every employee in every department takes great pride in their work and it shows. THE UNION LEAGUE OF PHILADELPHIA is a private members only club, but it's apparent that the employees have a great reverence for this historic

ENLIGHTENED *and* CONSISTENT GOVERNANCE



In 1996, the League adopted a plan of renovation and improvement known as *Vision 2000*, with the goal of improving the League, eliminating fiscal short falls and growing the membership. Professional surveys were conducted of the membership which provided the starting point and the areas needing the most attention. The League's leadership then conducted master planning sessions to develop a strategy that put the League on the right path for growth while establishing firm financial ground for future generations. From this plan came consecutive years of increased membership and operational surplus along with the opening of the parking garage and the lowest member attrition rate in 25 years.

This strategy of surveying the membership and using the information to set the agenda for master planning has been in place since this time and has been the architect behind all of the League's improvements to

include: the overnight rooms, renovation of the first floor members' only space, creation of 1862 and Founders and *The Sir John Templeton Heritage Center*, along with the upcoming kitchen, ballroom and fitness projects. In addition, the growth and stability of our membership is stronger than ever with a 50% increase in members proposing new members.

Everything done at the League is now done with the master plan in mind. Each new President and their Board spend a great deal of time strategizing along with the General Manager on how to keep the League's mission: *To provide an environment for the preservation of the traditions supporting democracy, our Country's constitutional form of government and the free enterprise system as expressed in our motto, Love of Country Leads, and to promote and enhance the social interaction and camaraderie among the members by having world class quality programs, service and facilities*

which support the business, educational, charitable, social, recreational, cultural and civic needs of our members and their families.

One of the most noticeable traits among the League's leadership has been the consistent commitment of all the Presidents and their respective Boards to serve the League's interests above all else. The League has had 67 Presidents since its inception and in that time, each has adapted a steady approach, guiding the organization forward, proudly demonstrating the privilege of serving their fellow members.

Today, the League has evolved, and in doing so, has grown to be a dynamic full service club offering a plethora of amenities and services to the membership. This has only been possible with the full support and guidance of the League's leaders.





Members can have this same service at their fingertips on the go with the League's App which works across iPhone, Blackberry and Android.


Following @TheUnionLeague ensures that members are up to date with the latest trending League news



really sets the tone for a fantastic year full of family, friends and fun.

SPIRIT *of* GENEROSITY *in the* COMMUNITY



Since its founding in 1862, THE UNION LEAGUE OF PHILADELPHIA has been a civic leader in the city of Philadelphia. Over the past 150 years, this service has ranged from raising troops during the Civil War and lobbying for enforcement of the "freedom" amendments during Reconstruction, to feeding the hungry during the Great Depression, to finding jobs for returning veterans after World War II. The Foundations of the Union League, Youth Work, Scholarship and Abraham Lincoln, carry on this legacy of civic and charitable activity.

Members support these charities through voluntary contributions and by volunteering in a variety of programs that enable the Foundations to carry on these missions. Each year,

hundreds of members assist with historic tours of the League House, acting as facilitators for educational programs and interviewing scholarship applicants. In 2011, the Foundations concluded a successful capital campaign which raised over \$10 million for the construction of The Sir John Templeton Heritage Center, and for the endowment and operations of these charities. Nearly all of this support was made possible through the generosity of the members of the League.

In order to spread the messages of the Foundations and to share the unique history of the League, there are many events and activities planned each year including: Youth Work Day, Scholarship Awards Dinner and the Golf Classic. Proceeds from many

League events, either in whole or in part, are donated to the Foundations.

Each February, the League opens its doors to the public for an Open House - everyone is welcome and the dress code is forgiven for this special occasion. Docents lead historical tours and answer questions about the storied halls, those who have walked them and the many events and activities that take place each year.

Additionally, The Sir John Templeton Heritage Center offers times each week when non-League members are invited to come in and to experience the history. Students and researchers, by appointment, are also welcome to browse the impressive collections.

PRUDENT FISCAL MANAGEMENT



Responsible fiscal management has been a keystone in the success of the League and a major part of the master plan. If the master plan is the platform from which all changes and improvements are decided, the Board's management of the budget and all resources is the supporting structure holding it in place.

In the past 12 years, the League has experienced continuous and positive growth, both in our membership and in our financial standing. This progress can be attributed to the determination of each President and their respective Boards to make membership growth and financial stability two of their most important priorities.

General Manager Jeff McFadden has trained all of the Executive Managers how to construct and

watch over their budgets. In addition to managing the numbers, each manager has been given the tools to develop the budgets from the ground up and to reforecast those numbers each month. Financial responsibility is everyone's job and it is something that is taken very seriously.


In 2002, the Board created the Board Designated Fund which was set up in case of a "rainy day." The goal is to grow this fund and to use the interest to offset and pay for capital improvements. When this began in 2002, the fund had \$500,000, and today it totals \$4.2 million. Prior to this, there was no real "savings account" for the League. The Board Designated Fund is funded from 100% of Life membership dues and 25% of all Entrance Fees. This was a wise step that will have far reaching benefits for generations to come.

The League has made \$62 million in capital improvements to the League House over the past 15 years starting with the expansion and upgrade to the overnight rooms and culminating in the last phases of the master plan to include the kitchen/ballroom and the fitness center. These capital projects were funded two-thirds through operational surplus and one-third through member assessment.

Due to the excellent fiscal management employed by the League's leadership, these changes and improvements became, and continue to become, a reality. The League is prepared to not only meet the needs of the membership today, but to also be ready for the members of the future.



UNIVERSAL ACKNOWLEDGEMENT *of* GREATNESS



With this latest milestone of being recognized as the #1 *City Club*, it is now more apparent than ever before that the League truly is the preeminent Club in the United States of America.

So many facets of League life contribute to the overall success. There are 10 criteria that make a club Platinum – each one equally important. There are 298 employees in 17 departments, 3,250 members with 21 serving on the Board of Directors, three distinct restaurants boasting exceptional cuisine, 14 unique private dining rooms, a 25,000 volume library, a fitness center, a business center, 84 beautifully appointed hotel rooms and countless amenities. This is a case where the whole is truly greater than

the sum of its parts – each a spoke in the wheel of success.


